# "Resourcing to Risk" – Changes to the way Warwickshire Fire Service is deployed.

# Stratford-on-Avon District Councillors have approved the new Council Plan.

- 3. Health and Wellbeing Health and wellbeing will be at the heart of the decisions we make.
- 4. Climate Change The time to act is now, we will lead the fight against climate change.
- 5. Delivery of Service We will use your money responsibly in delivering the best services possible.
- 6. Residents and Communities We will act in the best interest of our communities throughout our District understanding their needs to make responsible decisions.

## Five Year Draft Budget Proposal

The Liberal Democrat led District Council have released their draft budget for 2024 through to 2029 for public consultation.

In brief, the draft budget provides for: -

- £28,000 for the employment of Rural Crime Advisors, working with the Community Safety Team, to improve response to rising rural crime.
- £85,000 to continue financial support for the UBUS service.
- £25,000 funding to get people active through a new Leisure Community Instructor to provide targeted support for people with long term health conditions. Also proposed is a reduction in hire fees for use of public playing pitches in Stratford.
- £250,000 is proposed to continue to protect residents from the ongoing cost of living crisis.
- £500,000 of extra funding to address the Climate Emergency to enable the Council to achieve its carbon reduction targets.
- £250,000 to run the refuse collection vehicles on biofuel to reduce net carbon dioxide emissions.
