A Reasonably Quiet Two Months on the Common

Due to holidays and the time of year, it has been a reasonably quiet two months for Friends of Yarningale Common.

Volunteer's Activity Day – Fallen Trees Removed

However, Friends of Yarningale Common held one volunteer's activity day in December when we cleared two fallen trees blocking paths, one across the path to the Mound and another blocking the path from Chapel House down to Hill View.

Pile of Fallen Tree Trunks Made Safe

The pile of fallen tree trunks, that had been removed from the large pond by the tree surgeons, on the north side of Ossetts Hole Lane, next to Dingleburry, Pond 1, had been left in an unsafe manner and was made safer by Friends of Yarningale Common.

Clearing Some Sprouting Invasive Holly

Some of the invasive holly, that is sprouting from the stumps in the area previously cleared on the north side of Ossetts Hole Lane, as part of the Warwickshire County Council Biodiversity Management Plan, was removed.
