THE MONTHLY HMM...

Two Out of Three



We are not long back from a lovely break in the wilds of Wales. There were lots of special sightings to enjoy. Red kites coming to a valley feeding station in their 100's and cock linnets singing their hearts out in coastal gorse were just two of many highlights. Even so, these were not our targets. Wales is noted as the summer home of choice for a trio of summer migrants that faithfully return to valley oakwoods from Africa every April.

Wales is their British headquarters, and we hoped to see them all.

Visually the male redstart his red tail a quiver, blue-grey mantle and black face mask is the most gorgeous. Vocally, the wood warbler is the master instrumentalist with complete control of his syrinx. And the boldly patterned pied flycatcher is the master of kinesthetics as it forages insects in the verdant woods that teem with life as Spring turns to Summer.





We got many gorgeous views of the flycatchers, but the other members of the trinity proved elusive. True, we saw redstarts fleetingly and heard one singing whilst we waited for kites to come and feed. Wood warblers however, were impossible to find and despite all the joys we experienced we felt incomplete.

As we enter Trinity season, the longest in the Church's calendar by a considerable margin, my sense of birding incompleteness effectively underlines the essential glory and unity of the eternal Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Even though, strictly speaking, the existence of the Trinity cannot be directly proven from Holy Scripture, the doctrine of the Trinity is central to mainstream Christian faith.

At this season of Trinity as we consider how we should live in God's creation in the light of Christ's resurrection and the gift of the Spirit we must indeed worship the unity of the Godhead and pray for a steadfast faith and protection from all adversities. As I learned in Wales, two out of three ain't bad – but it's not enough.

STRATFORD ON AVON DISTRICT COUNCILLOR'S REPORT - JULY

Nature Recovery Project

Stratford District Council Cabinet has approved £35,000 funding for the 'Free Trees for Farmers Scheme' and £20,000 for the 'Wilder Communities Project', which will be delivered alongside the Warwickshire Wildlife Trust. Both schemes aim to plant more trees, hedges and wildflowers across the district. The decision follows the success of previous Free Trees for Farmers schemes.

South Warwickshire Local Plan (SWLP)

In order to keep to the tight deadline to complete the SWLP, the District Council Cabinet has agreed to use the services of a multi-disciplinary consultancy service starting in July. The cost will be shared with Warwick District Council. The first job for the consultants is to collate the huge public response the Councils have received to the Preferred Options Consultation held earlier this year.

Great Big Green Week

Stratford's Great Big Green Week has now come to an end. Many of the 60+ events were oversubscribed as I discovered when I tried to book on to a couple of events! However, I am looking forward to visiting a passive house under construction shortly through the Great Big Green Week.

It's now a firm fixture in the Stratford calendar. Thanks to all who gave their time and organised activities. I'm looking forward to next year!

Community Kitchen

Stratford's Community Kitchen is a fabulous initiative to prevent fresh food from being wasted. Volunteers use surplus food from local supermarkets to produce tasty, healthy meals on a pay as you feel basis – if you can't afford to pay, you don't have to, but donations are welcome. How is the Council structured?

I thought it worth penning a few lines for those interested in the structure of the Council.

The Council is comprised of Officers (employees of the Council – civil servants) and elected Councillors (politicians). The Officers run council services day-to-day. The political party with the most elected Councillors forms a 'Cabinet' which consists of the Leader, deputy leader and portfolio holders. The Cabinet is the executive and sets the priorities for the Council through its annual budget and new policies.

The Overview & Scrutiny Committee, chaired by a Councillor from the opposition party (the party with the second most Councillors), reviews Cabinet decisions and suggests changes and improvements. There are other Committees that oversee the other functions of the Council which include Employment, Audit & Standards, Regulatory and Planning.

There are broadly five 'departments' of the District Council - Housing & Customer Services, Resources, Law & Governance, Planning & Economic Development and Environmental & Neighbourhood Services. Each department is led by an Officer known as Head of Service. Each Head of Service works alongside a Councillor selected by the Leader, known as the portfolio holder.



Most importantly, however, I work within the community to support residents with planning, housing and other District Council issues.

Claverdon Station update

Following the article "Now arriving at Platform 1" – April 2025 edition, two new developments have now been completed at Claverdon Railway Station.

Firstly, the large wooden planter (sited underneath the newly installed Running in Board) has been filled with soil and plants. Once the plants are established, they will add colour and visual appeal, creating a more welcoming atmosphere for passengers. In addition, the plants can help to increase biodiversity and attract pollinators.

Secondly, a statue of William Shakespeare has been installed at most of the railway stations along the route between Birmingham Moor Street and Stratford upon Avon (the birthplace of William Shakespeare) and the stations at Bearley and Claverdon.

Installing this artwork aims to connect each station with a different
Shakespeare play. King Lear is the play chosen for
Claverdon Station - the story of an aged king of ancient Britain whose plan to divide his kingdom among his three daughters ends tragically.



The statues were made possible thanks to the Friends of the Shakespeare Line (FoSL) volunteers, who conceived, funded and installed them and have enjoyed the support of Network Rail, West Midlands Trains, and Chiltern Railways.

Passengers travelling between these stations can now enjoy a unique journey as they make their way to the home of the world's most famous playwright.



AND FINALLY...A GLASS OF WINE?

My earliest experiences of drinking wine were as a student, typically Blue Nun Liebfraumilch and Mateus Rosé. The empty bottles were used to make table lamps. In the years that followed it was popular to make home-made wine and beer. My wine attempts included one batch made from cold tea and more ambitiously a rum made from marrows. Nettle wine was very popular but not in my repertoire. When briefly working in Germany a work colleague sent a case of the local dry white (hock) home to his parents in Yorkshire. When he returned home they told him they had quite enjoyed it, but they had needed to add a little sugar!

When we lived in Nottingham, a group from my office set off each November to bring back the Beaujolais Nouveau at its earliest availability. On their return one year, I was invited to an early morning tasting and I found them pouring the Beaujolais on their breakfast cereals!

Russell, a good friend of ours worked in Brussels in the EU and his directorate was responsible for various agriculture products including wine. In the course of this onerous role he became professionally knowledgeable about European wines and he was awarded various prestigious tasting accreditations. When we went on holiday with him and his wife to Bali, the restaurant served the wine from what looked like large paraffin canisters. I had to admire his 'sang froid' about the whole experience. On another occasion I found myself at a dinner with the directors of a Brewing Company that owned a well-known off-license chain. After dinner they invited me to join a little experiment in which it proved that not everyone around the table could tell bitter from lager from Guinness when blind-folded! They assured me that as the evening progressed few of them would be able to tell white wine from red if similarly blind-folded.

We have some English friends who live in France and on one occasion they came to stay with us and brought with them their local French doctor and his wife. I thought it would be fun to offer them some English wine. They sipped from their glasses and offered generous appreciation, but I somehow knew that it was an act of being good guests. I once received a post card from my brother that simply said: Ecclesiastes 9:7


