

Claverdon Cricket Club 150 years

On Sunday 29th June Claverdon cricket club turned 150 years old. This makes it one of the oldest in the country and older than Warwickshire Cricket club!



In 1875 the youth of the village were given permission to use a corner of the field behind the old school to play cricket on. Three Kyte brothers and the son of the local wheelwright and local butcher, Walter Lowe, set about teaching the villagers about the game. At that time bowling was underarm. Before WW1 a bitter split

occurred, and a breakaway team set themselves up on a field behind Crown farm. After a reconciliation, the clubs were reunited on the hallowed ground where we still play today. The former pavilion was a shed in the corner of the field. How lucky we are to have the refurbished facilities we have now.

The records show several family names recurring, the Jarretts, Farmers, Kytes and more recently some names that the older village residents might remember: Bill and Steve Rogers and their dog Ziggy. Ian Read was the men's captain for 16 years. Also named were Derek Farr, Terry and Nick Sandy,



Ricky Gunn, a previous winner of the young player award, who came up from London for the celebration day. The Richardsons and the Parkers, Matt Parker is our current groundsman. The early passing of Colin Parker introduced the idea of a club Memorial Day where the women would also play. More recently the Hammond family have played a leading role in the club, Vince as chairman for many years.

In 2017 the CEO of Warwickshire cricket board contacted the club to invite the women to a soft ball tournament, and this resulted in the development of the women's team.

Care and Concern

A strange thing happened at our holiday let in Anglesey this summer. We were enjoying the glorious late evening sunshine when we were disturbed by a sudden and disconcerting bang. "What was that?" questioned my wife, Laura. "Who knows?" I answered unhelpfully and without care as I continued to edit the day's photographs in Lightroom.



Thank goodness for Laura's concern. We established that the cause of the bang was a juvenile blackbird that had flown straight into the conservatory windows. It lay sprawled, apparently lifeless where it fell. "Look, it's wriggling its legs and panting for breath," Laura said hopefully for although it looked in agony, it was at least definitely alive. Remarkably, cupped in the warmth of Laura's hands, the youngster quickly recovered itself and flew off into the hedge. Amazing what a bit of care and concern can do.

As I write this 'Hmm' it is co-incidentally, the lesser festival (13th August) of that most remarkable Victorian lady, the famous 'Lady of the Lamp', Florence Nightingale. Most famous for answering a cri de coeur from The Times' war correspondent for women to nurse wounded soldiers in the Crimea, the founder of modern nursing practice also saved a young owl that was being tormented by a gang of youths in Athens. She called it Athena.

It leads me to conclude that the Collect prayer for the week is absolutely providential. That payer petitions God to put away from us all hurtful things and to give us only those things that are profitable. What a prayer, and of course we have a role to play as both Florence and Laura demonstrated. A role of care and concern for all Creation – men and women, owls and blackbirds.

Once she had rescued Athena from his tormentors, Florence often carried him around in her pocket, rather like a kangaroo transports her joey. And all this before she went to the Crimea. No wonder that God called her to a ministry of care and concern.

STRATFORD ON AVON DISTRICT COUNCILLOR'S REPORT - SEPTEMBER

Help shape the future of local government for Warwickshire.

You may recall from previous articles that the government, via the English Devolution White Paper, has mandated changes to the way local government works, combining District and County Councils to make Unitary Authorities.

A consultation is now underway (closing on the 14th September) seeking your view on having two Unitary Authorities – one for North Warwickshire (Nuneaton / Bedworth / Rugby) and one for South Warwickshire (Warwick, Leamington & Stratford). I currently favour the two Unitary Authority solution over and an all-Warwickshire Unitary Authority for two reasons:

- 1. The English Devolution White Paper also requires Unitary Authorities to group together to form 'Strategic Authorities'. It is early days and things may change, but as it stands, it's not clear who we could group with. Many of the bordering Authorities have already identified their group and it does not include Warwickshire. By having a north and south Unitary Authority, we can combine to make a whole Warwickshire Strategic Authority.
- 2. I'm concerned that any new authority, which will be larger and cover a wider area than the District Council, will be more remote from residents and Parish Councils. There is a balance between gaining efficiencies associated with larger organisations, and the organisation becoming too large to be a part of the community it seeks to serve. My view is that the balance is closer with the two Unitary Authority solution.

Both solutions risk spreading Councillors too thin by making the area they serve too large. In my submission I have pressed for the new Unitary Authority to keep the same size areas as the current District Council (about 3500 residents) to ensure there is no reduction in service to residents and Parish Councils.

The Warm Homes Local Grant

The new funding scheme to help homeowners and private rented tenants stay warm and cut energy costs is now open for applications.

The Warm Homes Local Grant funding aims to improve the warmth and comfort of more of the worst performing homes across the District, whilst also reducing energy bills, carbon emissions and levels of fuel poverty.

There are two key criteria for eligibility:

• Have a combined annual household income under £36,000 (savings are not assessed) or receive means- tested benefits or are vulnerable to the cold.

Have a home EPC rating D or worse – But you don't need an EPC rating to apply – See below

I would suggest anyone who has a household income below £36,000 and has a house more than 40 years old should apply.

The initial online application takes 5 minutes and asks you some simple questions about your house if you do not have an EPC rating. After this an assessor will ring you to discuss your application in more detail. If you are eligible for the scheme, an assessor will visit your home to determine the best energy efficiency measures, which could be various types of insulation, double glazing or clean heating sources. Any approved measures will be installed completely free of charge. Whilst this is paid for by the District Council – EON are the service provider

The Dorothea Mitchell Hall and Recreation Ground Trustees' Annual Report year ending 28 February 2025. (Charity No: 1195282)

The Charity was established in 1918. In 2021, the Hall and its assets and liabilities were updated to a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO), to better manage its day-to-day activities and legal requirements. The main focus of the charity is with regard to the Village Hall which was built in 1913 and plays an important part in the life of Claverdon village. A variety of events and classes take place in the hall, throughout the week and it continues to provide health and social benefits for local residents. The entrance to the car park was resurfaced during the year and the trustees commissioned a full building survey. Whilst the Hall was found to be in good condition overall, a detailed maintenance schedule has been drawn up to prioritise recommended tasks going forward. This will ensure the Hall remains a top-quality functional space. The Charity has maintained positive cash reserves to support the running of the Hall and to ensure capital investment continues. With regard to sustainability, the Trustees actively consider environmental impact when making decisions and hirers of the Hall are encouraged to conserve energy resources when using the facilities. Completion of the maintenance work identified in the aforementioned survey will enable future investment in renewable energy to make the Hall more sustainable. Trustees endeavour to use local contractors and suppliers to support the local economy and further limit the carbon footprint. Most recently, the Hall has welcomed back theatre performances. These activities utilise the excellent staging and there are plans to offer regular performances going forward. We welcome suggestions on other events the Village would like to see at the Hall. The attractive grounds have been very well maintained, including flower beds and boundary hedges. The additional voluntary efforts of some local residents in this respect are much appreciated. In order to comply with Charity Commission regulations, the Trustees have used professional advisors in regard to their tenants, namely: Claverdon Surgery, Claverdon Nursery, Claverdon Community Shop and Claverdon Lawn Tennis Club. We have also maintained relevant insurance throughout the period and performed required safety inspections in a timely manner. The Trustees meet ten times a year and have been fortunate to receive valued assistance from their Secretary/Treasurer. Village residents are openly invited to join the present trustees to help administer this important community asset.



LANGLEY PARISH COUNCIL

Langley is one of the smallest Parishes in Warwickshire, with one of the lowest annual precepts, but, with the retirement of the current incumbent, is now seeking a Clerk and RFO to work, on average, approximately 2 hours/week, mainly from home.

The candidate must have computer proficiency, simple secretarial skills, and a basic knowledge of finance.

Duties to include:

Prepare Agenda and distribute for the 6 annual Parish meetings. Attend meetings, take minutes, circulate and monitor required actions

Focal point for all incoming emails from SDC, administrative bodies, potential suppliers etc., Filter, distribute or respond as appropriate. Ensure Planning applications are circulated, and responses made within timescales.

Establish internet banking system and record all financial transactions. CLAVERDON AND DISTRICT NURSING FUND

Some people in Claverdon, Langley and Norton Lindsey have heard about the "Nursing Fund" but are not quite sure what it means. The original fund was started after World War 1 - well before the days of the National Health Service. It raised money to provide accommodation and salary for a district nurse with responsibility for the parishes of Beausale, Claverdon, Haseley, Hatton, Honiley, Langley, Norton Lindsey, Shrewley and Wroxall.

Responsibility for the nursing salary was taken over by the National Health Service, and the nurse's house was sold to Warwickshire County Council. In 1953 two new charities were established with the Charity Commission, and the proceeds of the house sale were divided between the Hatton Charity (serving Parishes of Beausale, Haseley, Hatton, Honiley, Shrewley and Wroxall) and the Claverdon Charity (serving Parishes of Claverdon, Langley and Norton Lindsey).

The sale of the District Nurse's house was invested to provide funds for the benefit of 'sick/poor' persons within the three villages such as medical comforts and medicines, bedding, fuel, provision of domestic help where none is available, defray costs of convalescence or hospital appointments.

Grants are available from the CDNF for those in need with health-related problems. Help has or could be given towards stair-lifts, Occupational Therapy investigations into difficult bathrooms and conversions of bath to shower, wheelchairs, ramps, short term domestic help during convalescence and travel to hospital parking.

Recently, donations of flowers or biscuits have been normal to express our concern/support for people in unfortunate circumstances.

Wolverton was never part of this arrangement and its residents have therefore never been able to benefit from them. Wolverton has its own similar fund, the Campion Trust, administered by Richard Livingston.

Members of the committee are Chairman, Treasurer\Secretary, Vicars of Claverdon and Norton Lindsey with Langley, a representative from Claverdon, Langley and Norton Lindsey Parish Councils, and a co-opted trustee from each village. There are normally two meeting a year, with additional ad-hoc meetings as necessary. Funds are invested in shares in the Charities Official Investment Fund and share income used for the benefit of "sick or persons in need" within the three villages. If anyone knows of someone who needs assistance, please do not hesitate to contact either the respective Vicars, the Chairman or the Treasurer\Secretary, or anyone from the committee.

Speed calming initiative back on the move after local elections delay – update

Progress on Claverdon's speed-calming programme briefly slowed during the local elections, when council capacity was diverted. That pause is over. The Parish Council and the CASE Team reconvened this week, restarted conversations with Warwickshire County Council, and reaffirmed our commitment to delivering the measures our village needs.

We now have a meeting scheduled for **early September** with **Zoé Masterman-Smith** (Highways Community Action Fund, County Highways, Warwickshire County Council) to move the scheme into delivery mode. Our focus is clear: secure the package outlined by Warwickshire Highways—targeted limit changes, entry gateways and roundels at key points, refreshed signage and road markings, and the supporting enforcement—to lower approach speeds and make everyday journeys safer for residents, schoolchildren, cyclists and pedestrians.

While the election period created a short delay, the initiative remains a top priority. We will continue to apply constructive pressure, work closely with our County and District Councillors, and keep the community updated on milestones and timescales. Thank you to everyone for your ongoing support and vigilance; your input and persistence are helping to make Claverdon a safer place for all.




